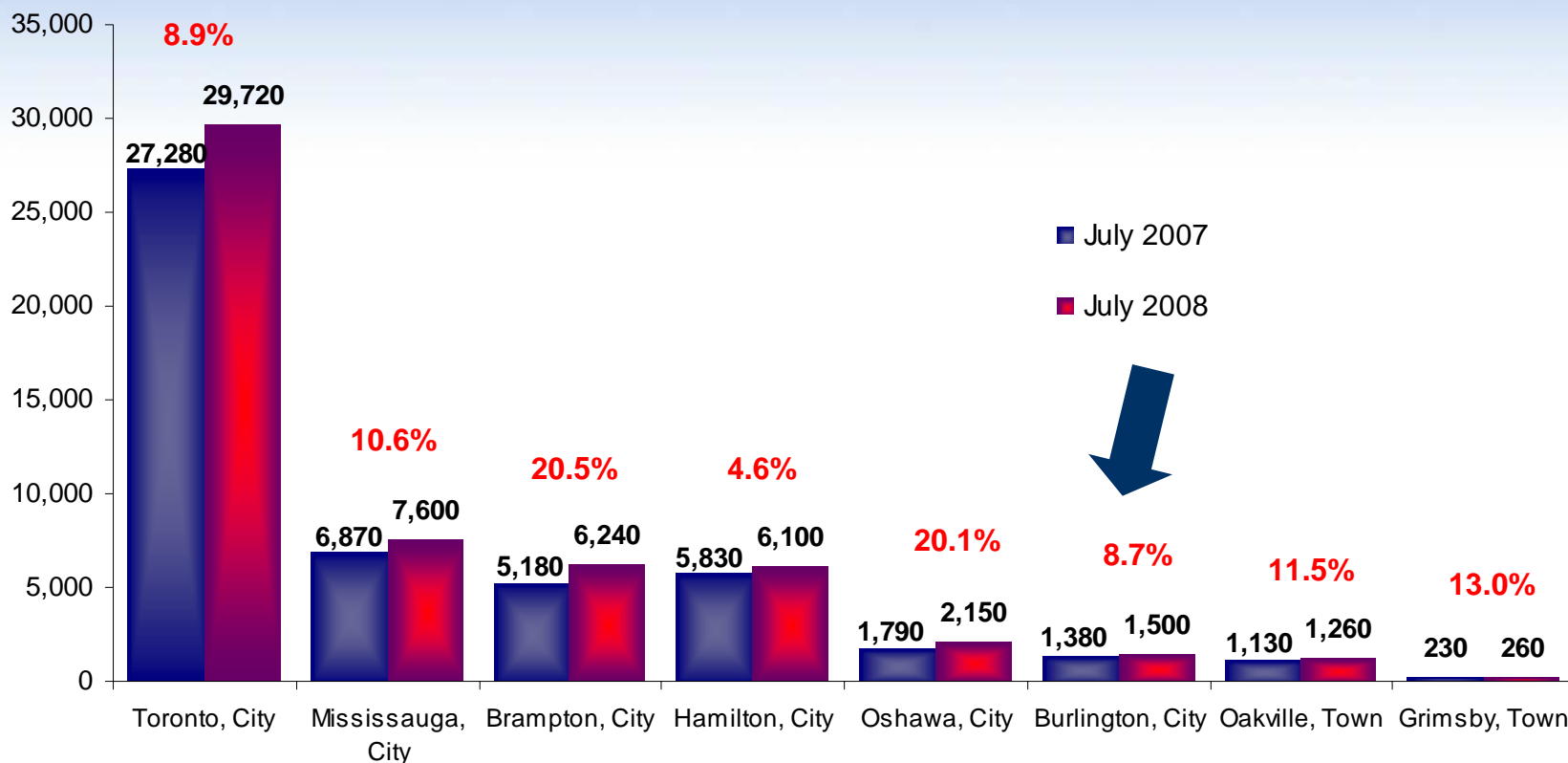

Number of Employment Insurance Beneficiaries & Percent Increases in the Burlington Area in July 2007 & July 2008

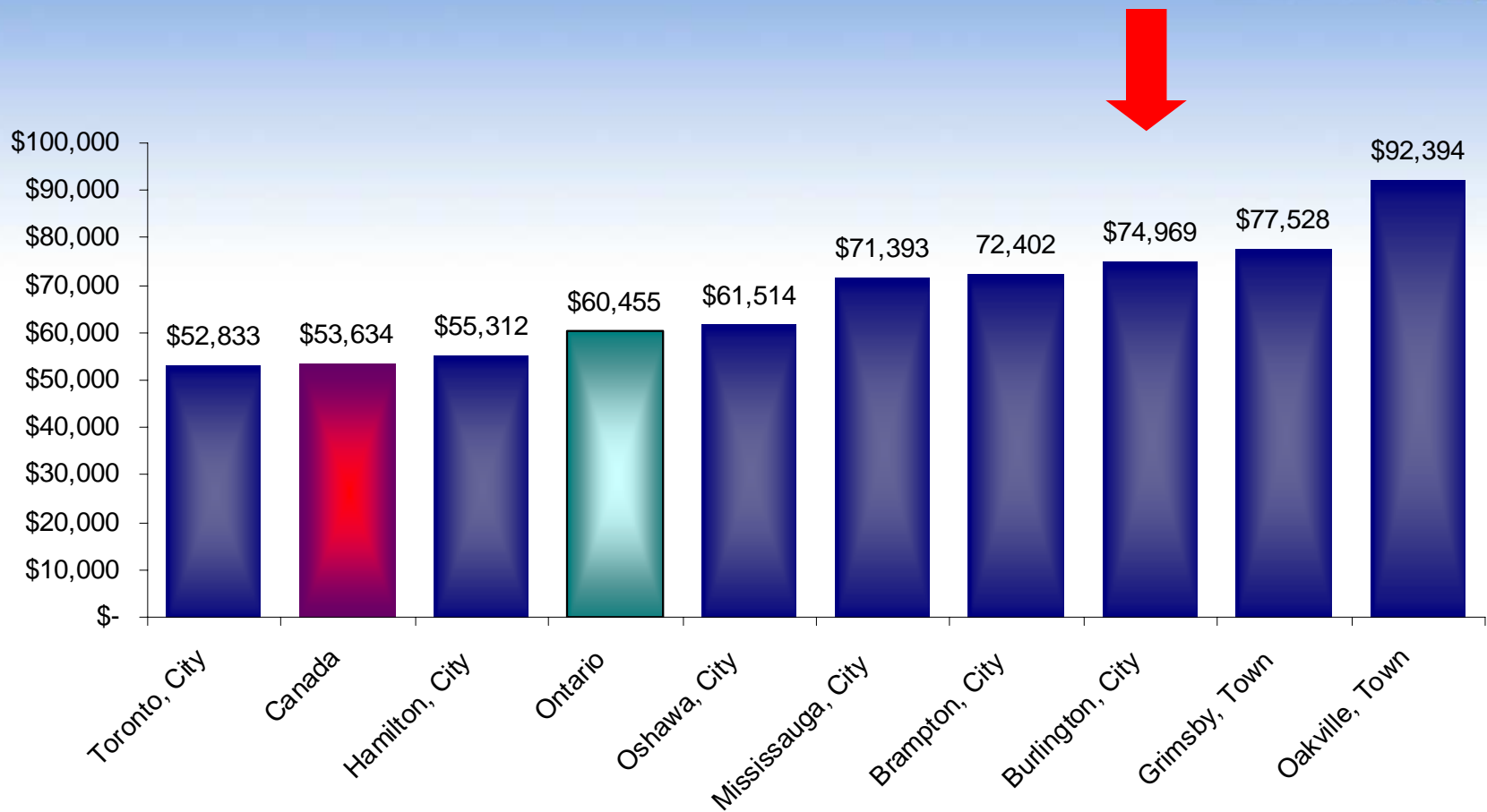


Median Income by Family Type for Burlington, Ontario & Canada in 2006

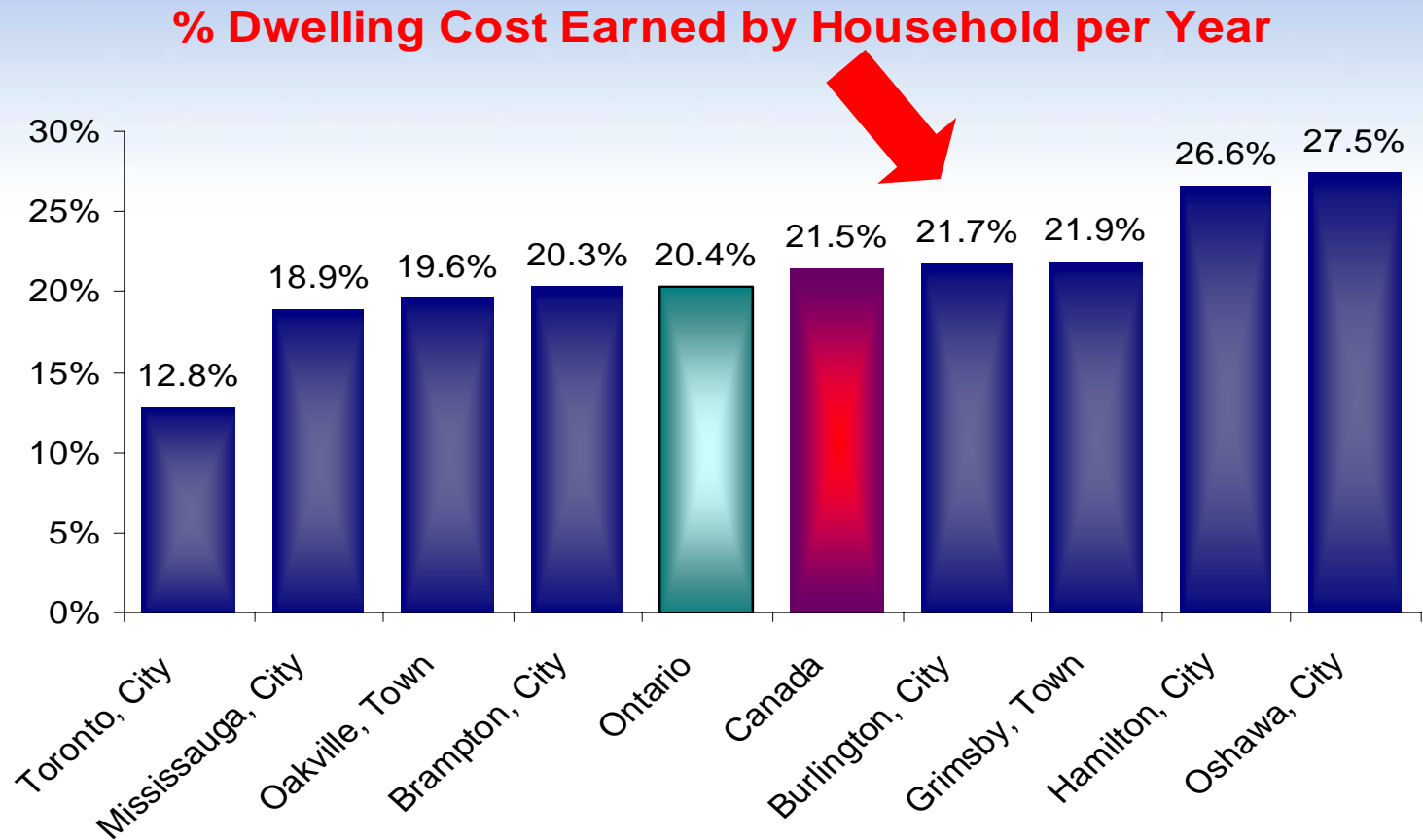
Median Household Income in the Burlington Area, 2005



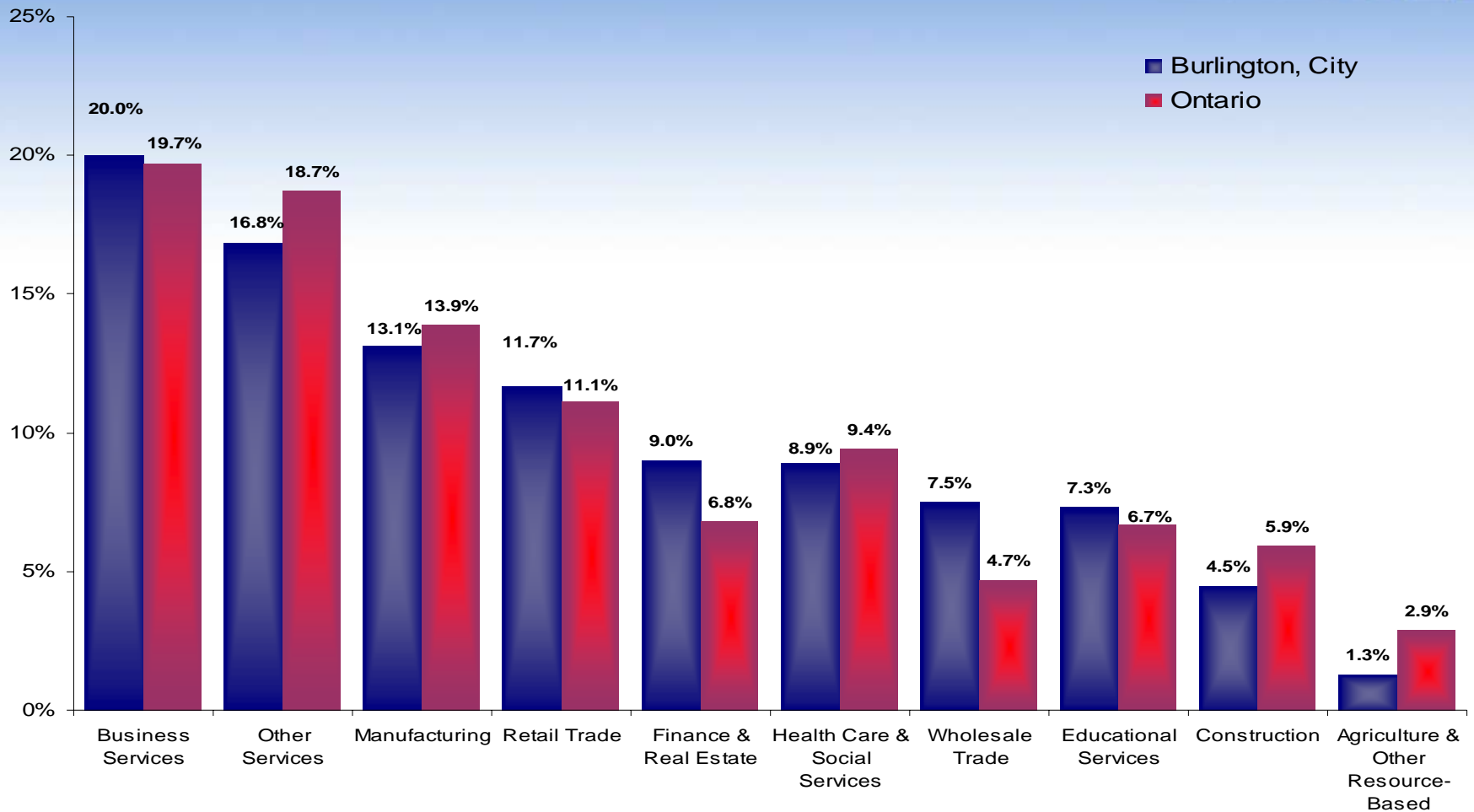
Average Value Of Dwellings in the Burlington Area, 2006



Average Value of Dwellings By Median Household Income for the Burlington Area, 2006

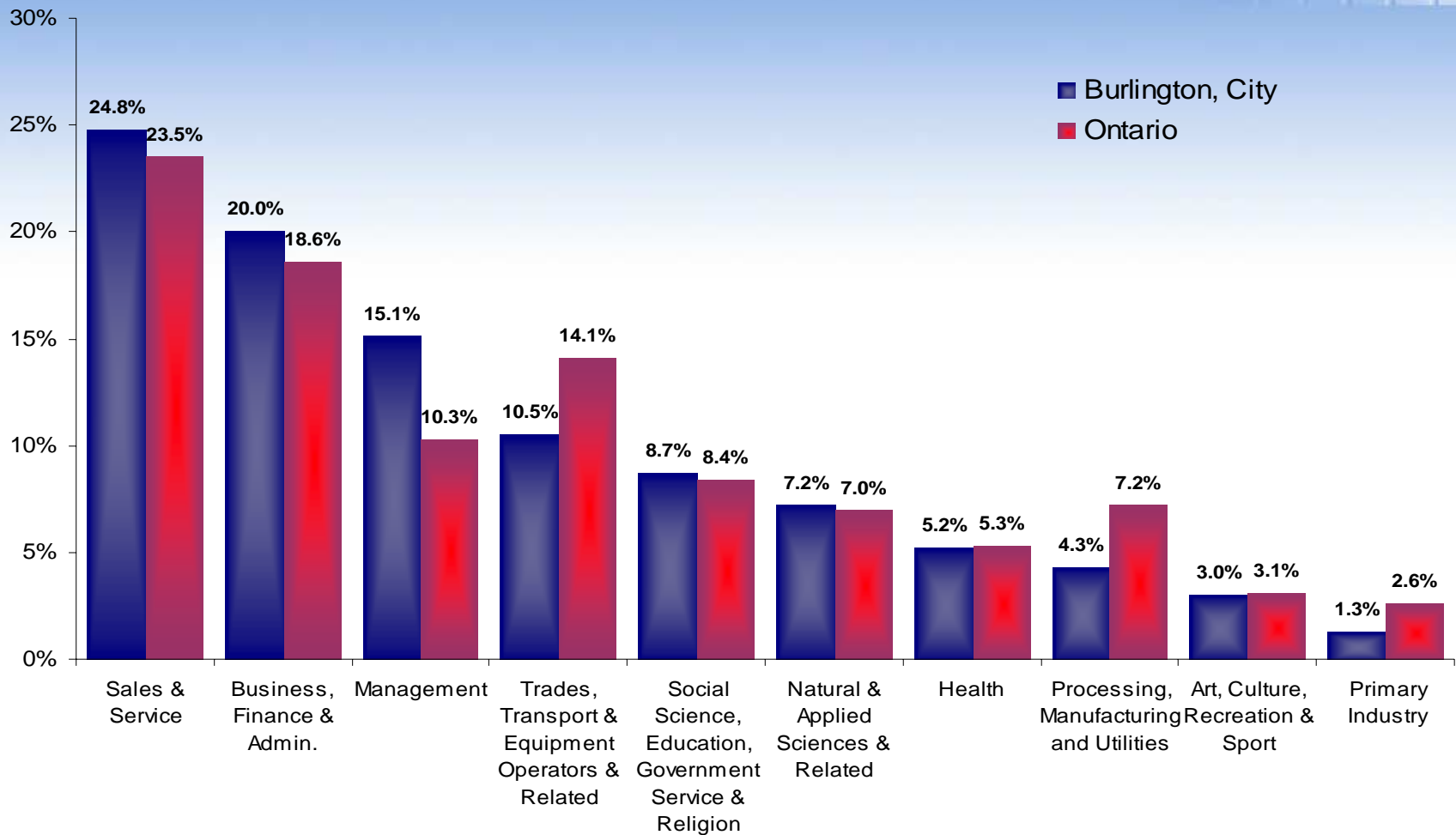

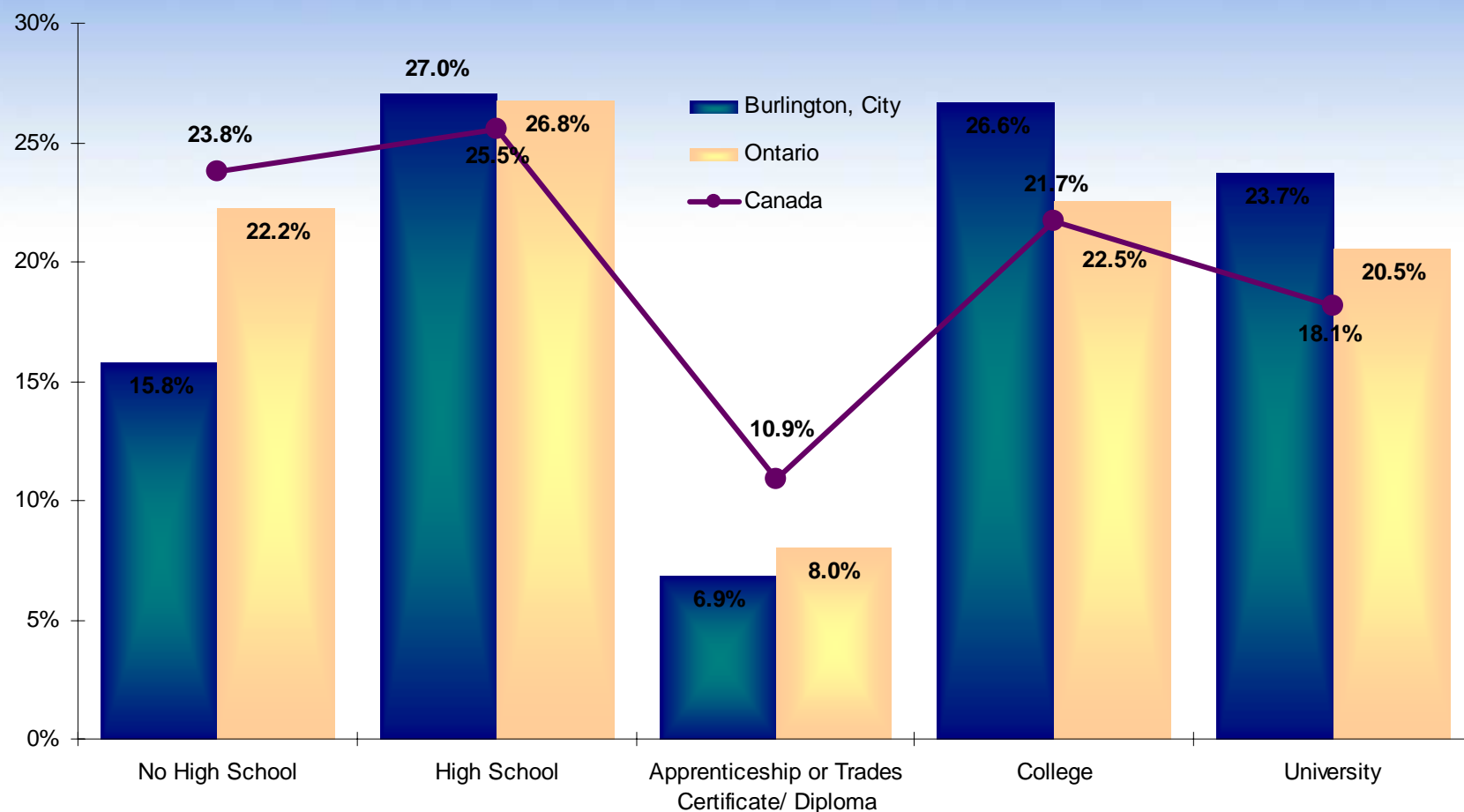

Occupations* of Employment for Burlington & Ontario, 2006



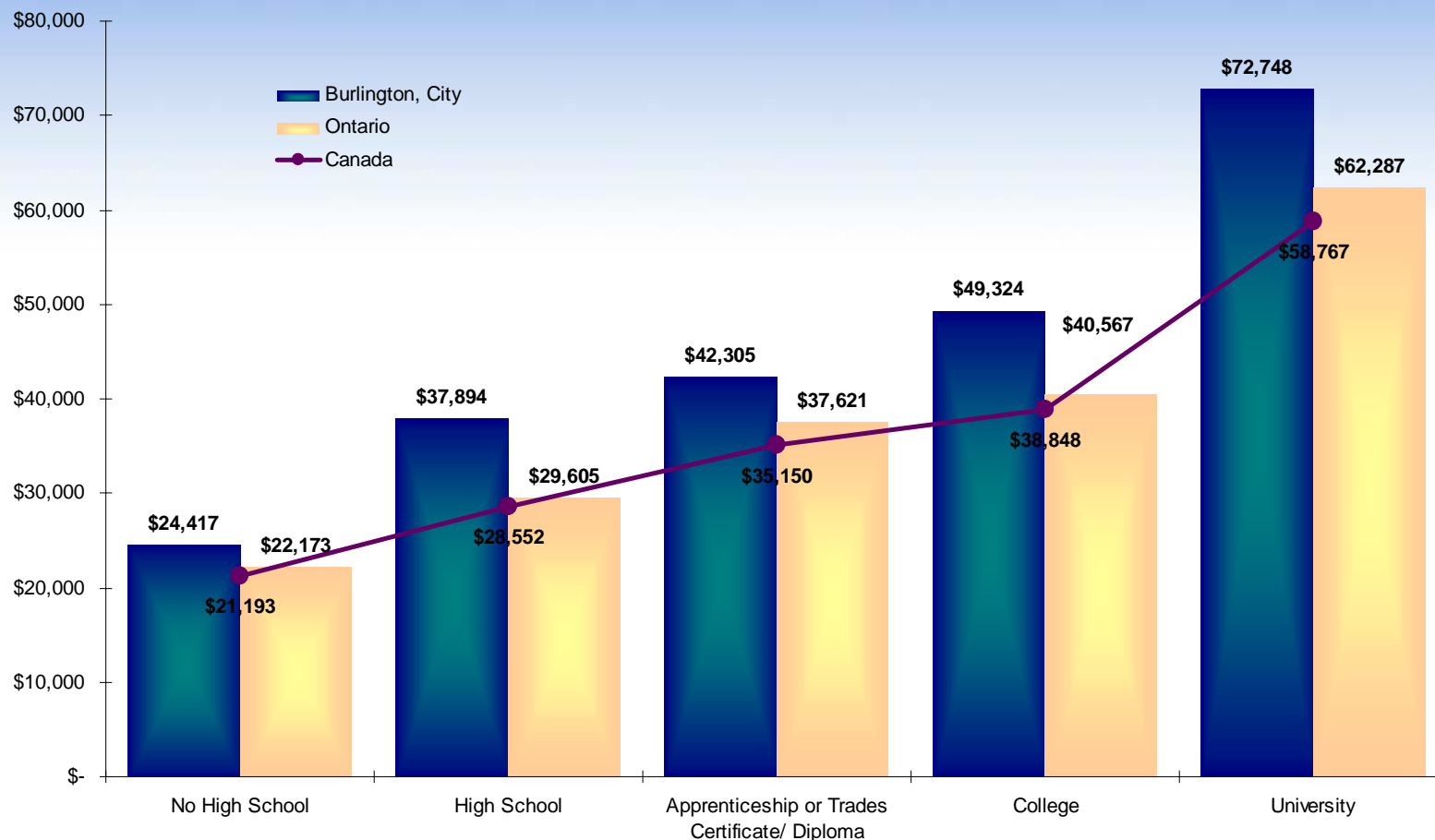

Level of Education for Burlington, Ontario & Canada Aged 15 Years and Over, 2006



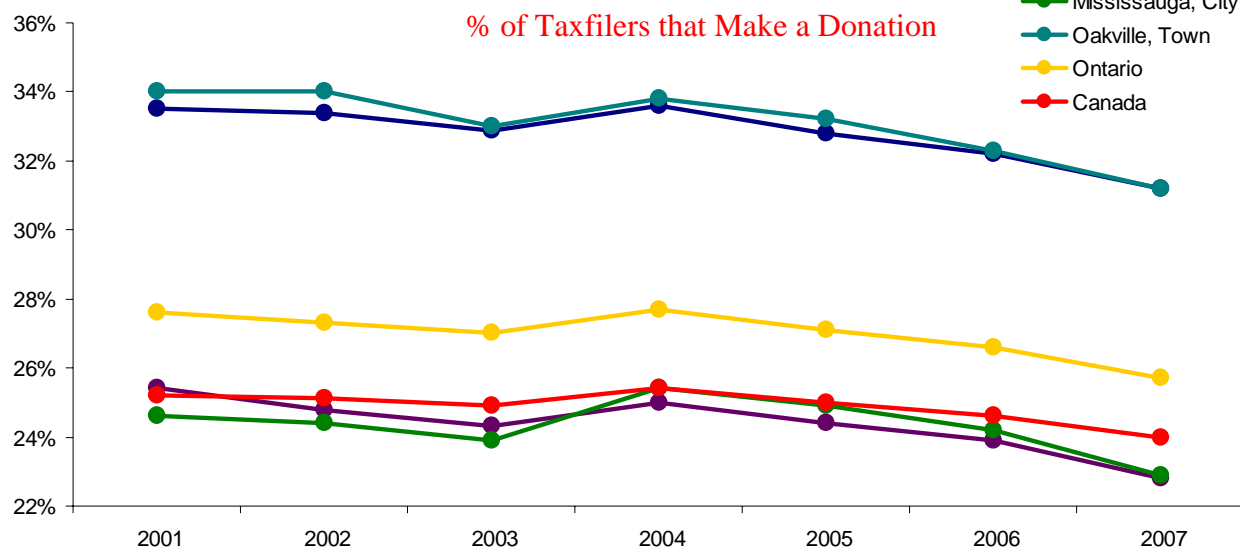
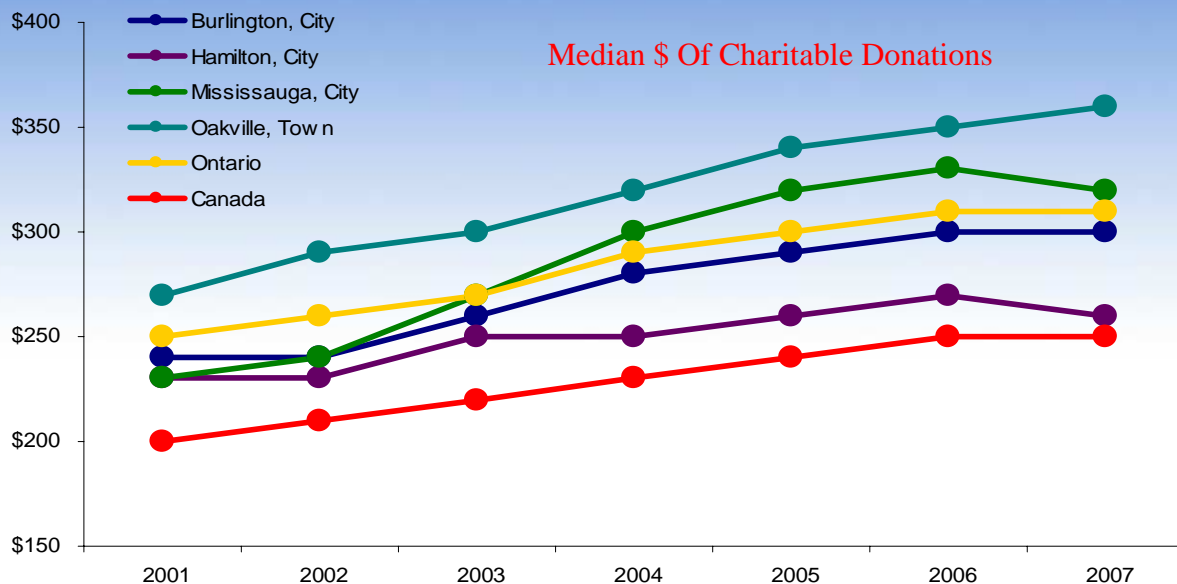

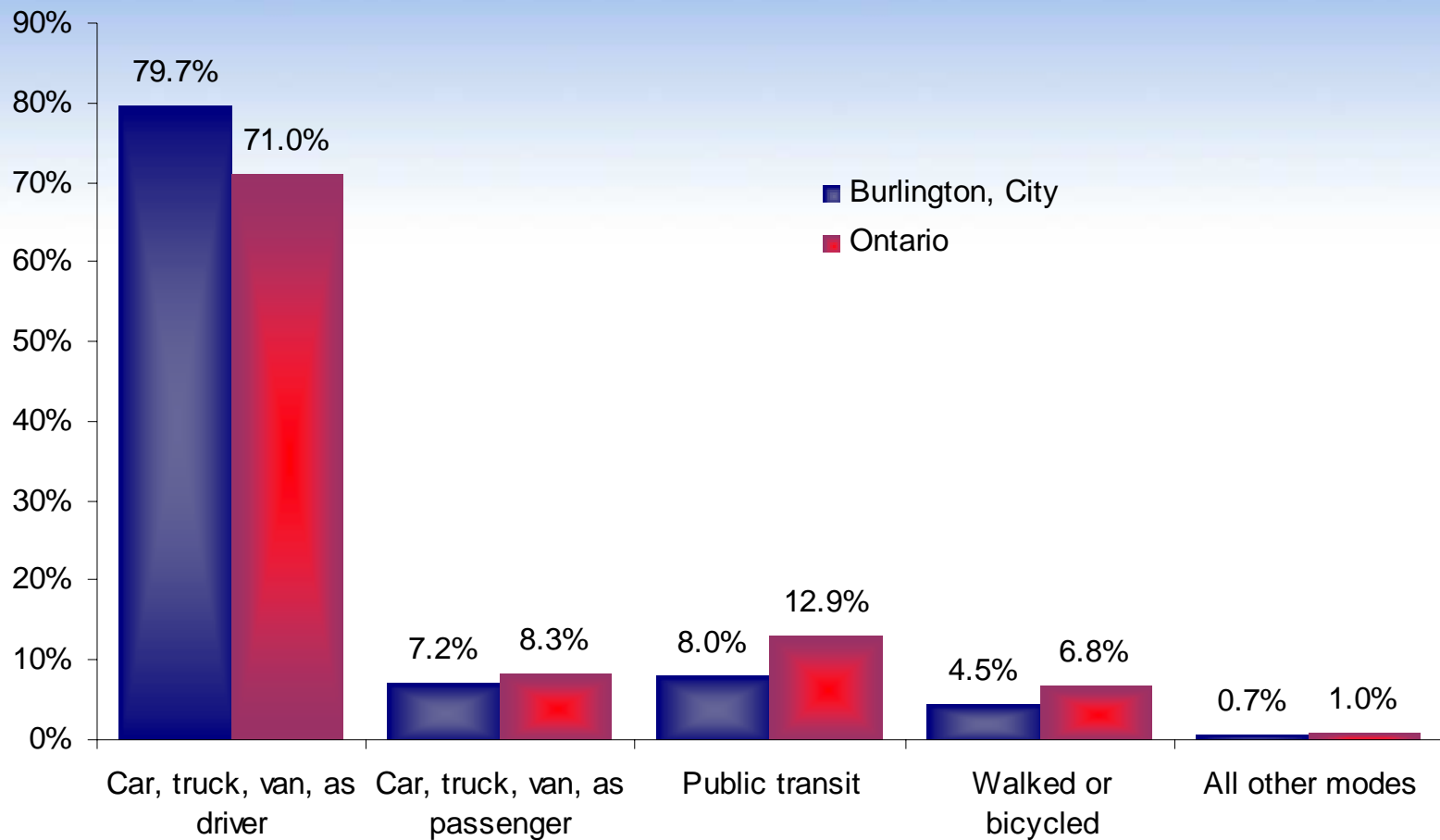
Charitable Donations in the Burlington Area, 2001 to 2007



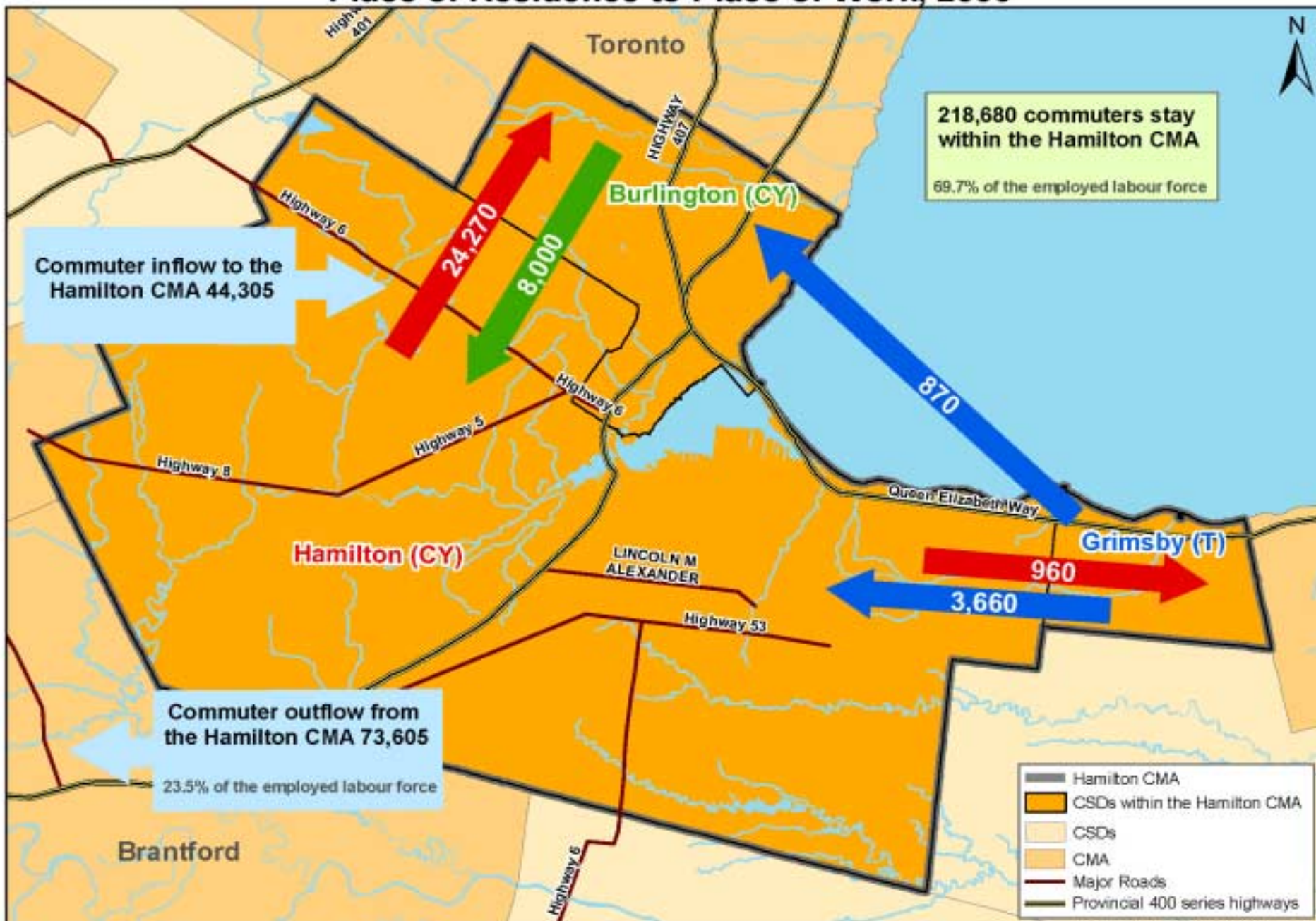
